Summer programs

just for preschoolers

Let's Travel To...the Beach!

Learn about our shores and explore the beautiful world of shells and seaweed. Enjoy a story, meet a hermit crab up close, and use colorful shells to create beautiful art.

Let's Travel To...the Ocean!

Who lives in our ocean? Find out! Little ones will try "fishing," enjoy an ocean story, touch real whale bones, and create their own sparkly ocean waterglobe!

Float Your Boat

What floats? What sinks? Little ones find out for themselves. Learn about floating shapes, try shaping a boat out of clay, and paint a boat to take home.

just for tweens & teens

Travel Back in Time: Create Colonial Paints

Discover how to make your own watercolor paints! Learn the dynamics of watercolor painting and mix your own pigments by creating dyes out of natural materials, such as fruits and vegetables.

Travel the Seas: Sailor Knot Jewelry

Learn how to tie a sailor's square knot and create your own ocean-inspired jewelry. Work with hemp cords and beads to fashion your own handmade creations. 1 hr.

Travel Back in Time: Intro to Crochet

Old craft, neat project: find out why crochet was a craze in the 1800s and learn how to crochet a sunglasses case for the summer. We will supply the yarn & crochet hook for participants to keep. 15 students. 1.5 hrs

Sea Art

Learn how life on the water and seafaring is linked with tattoos and body art. Try your hand at crushing leaves and flowers for their tints, and go home with a real henna tattoo design of your own!

Let's Travel... On A Ship

Ship to Shore

How do boats float? Find out! Learn about buoyancy, density, and boat design with your own clay boat and test how much cargo it can carry. Create a ship model.



A Sailor's Day

Ahoy! What did whalers take around the world with them? Find out about life on the water and touch nautical tools & artifacts. Decorate a Ditty Bag, a sailor's small drawstring bag for a ship's journey.



Sail With the Wind

Hop on board and discover how ships and sailboats use windpower! Experiment with the shapes of sails & create your own sailboat for your adventures.



Signal Flags

Find out how ships 'talk' to one another through signal flags. Learn about flags, play signal-flag twister or bingo, and design your own unique, colorful flag to fly.



Ship In A Bottle Workshop

Discover the classic hobby of sailors as they travelled the far seas around the world. Learn about ship parts, fun style, and create a simplified ship-in-a-bottle of your own. *Participants bring a wide-mouthed, label-free jar (such a pasta sauce jar) - we'll bring the rest! 1 hr.*



Let's Travel... On A Submarine

Operation Deep Sea

Visit the strangest place on the planet - the incredible and unusual Bottom of the Sea! Learn about glowing animals, erupting underwater volcanoes, and create your own deep-sea waterglobe. *Nearby sink required (restroom sink ok); if not available, craft can be changed to glow-in-the-dark sea creatures.*



Marine Biologists

Travel the seas and learn about its wonders: touch real whale bones, learn how to identify shells, and explore gooey seaweed. Design your own colorful shell art mosaic to take home.



Let's Travel... Round the World

Maps & Compasses

Calling all explorers... learn about maps and compasses for your journeys. Try magnetizing a needle, and never get lost again with your own compass necklace to wear. *(3rd grade & up)*



Sand From 'Round The World

Did you know sand can be glittery, powdery, or black? Find out what sand is made of & see sand specimens from around the globe. Create a Navajo-style sand painting.



Let's Visit... the Arctic!

Feeling hot this summer? Cool off with a trip to the arctic! Learn about glaciers, experiment with ice, and find out how blubber keeps animals warm. Make your own blubber batch.



Let's Visit... China!

Learn about Chinese traditions, symbols, and its most important holiday, the Lunar New Year. Pick up a brush and learn how to write "Whale" in Chinese calligraphy!



Let's Travel... Back in Time!

Toys From Long Ago

Find out what kids like you were playing with in the 1800s. Try out some old-fashioned classic toys and decorate your own wooden yo-yo to spin.



Life Long Ago

Zip back and learn about a time before ipods or lightbulbs. Try writing with a quill, playing historical games, and touching artifacts. Carve your own scrimshaw folk craft with a pickwick.



Native American Crafts

Learn about the first Long Island communities. Touch a Native American oil lamp, see real arrowheads, and design a stone arrowhead necklace or keychain, or create a cornhusk doll figure. *(library chooses craft).*



Fossil Explorers

Learn about prehistoric oceans! Touch real fossils, excavate a "fossil" and discover marine surprises, including fossilized shark teeth! Use your findings to create a fossil of your own.



Our Other Popular Summer Programs

Wonderful Whales

Learn about earth's biggest creatures! Touch amazing whale bones and teeth, learn about whale behaviors, and create a paper whale puppet to take home. *For preschoolers, with an adult.*

Festival of Bubbles!

Little ones can blow oodles of bubble mountains, try different bubble solutions, and create colorful bubble print art! *For preschoolers with adult*

Seaweed, Slime, and Squish

Explore the wet science of ocean slime. Touch different kinds of seaweed that grow locally on our shores, create your own batch of goo, and test it for squish, bounce, and stretch. *Grades 1-6*

Recycled Papermaking

Go green this summer and try your own hand at creating your own recycled, earth-friendly paper out of newspaper! Go home with your own recycled paper swatches that you create. *Grades 1-6*

Fizz, Goop, and Bubble!

Stick your hands into some goopy, slippery, fizzy science experiments! Blow mountains of bubbles, learn about stretchy polymers, and try out our recipe for slippery slime. Warning: Hands will get dirty. *Grades 1-6*

Ocean Artists' Workshop

Calling all artists! Enjoy a fun art-making session as you decorate a colorful ocean t-shirt. Bring any T-shirt, and we'll supply the paints, fabric markers, stencils, and other fun tools so you can go art wild! *Participants bring any T-shirt they would like to paint; we'll bring the rest. Grades 1-6*
