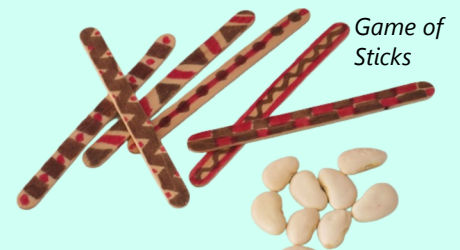
Spooky Sea Creatures!

Did you know Wampum beads are made from the shells of animals often found along Long Island's coasts? Discover the history of this ancient craft and learn what it means to Indigenous Long Islanders. Create a wampum-style beaded accessory of your own. *Kits required for online participants.*

A Whaler's Feast

How did Long Island whalers celebrate Thanksgiving at sea? Learn about some of the foods the whalers would enjoy for the holiday. Thinking about toys this season? Find out what kids like you were playing with in the 1800's!

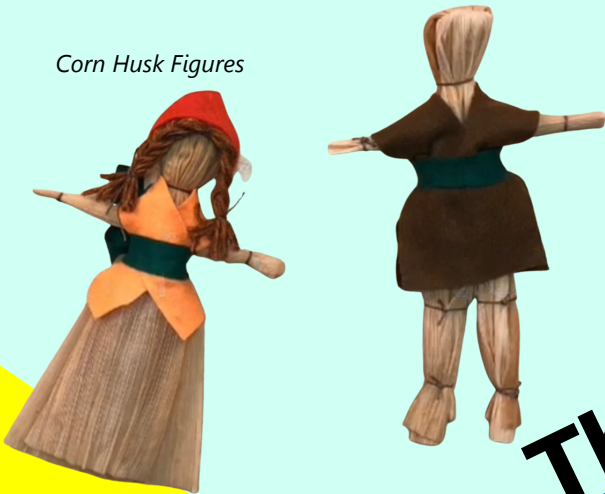
In-person participants will decorate a wooden top and a paper whirligig.
